

In planning for the upcoming holiday season, one of the ways I prepare is to work with our worship leaders to select music for our worship services. One particular hymn caught my attention in a special way, "Come, Ye Thankful People, Come" by Henry Alford. At first glance it is a perfect choice for a season of gratitude and thanksgiving, and it really does capture the season. However, what has set this hymn apart in my mind is learning more about its creation. The author, Henry Alford, composed the words in the middle 1800s in celebration of the English Harvest Festival, the British version of American Thanksgiving.

Alford was born in London and showed aptitude for learning and ministry, even composing a biography of the apostle Paul at the age of six (I have a six-year-old and this is highly uncommon for this age). But what sticks with me is what the Dean of Cambridge University said of him, "He was morally the bravest man I ever knew. His perfect purity of mind and singleness of purpose seemed to give him a confidence and unobtrusive self-respect which never fails him." (Robert Morgan, *Then Sings My Soul*)

This reference inspires me to imagine how we, too, are creating a legacy in our lives that bless and inspire others. To be defined, even by one person, as possessing a single-minded purpose is an accomplishment. Furthermore, to be known as a person of faith, taking with gratitude the gift of God in our life and producing something of value in the lives of others, is beyond commendable. As we enter into the holiday season, a season of gratitude, and celebration of hope through Jesus' birth and life, I pray we reflect on how we make meaning in the lives of others, as well as live true to the single-minded purpose our Creator has endowed within us.


Giving Tree Project
