

March 24 is Palm Sunday this year. In the Christian tradition, this is the day we remember Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem — an entry that would be his last into the city. It was just days before the trial and crucifixion of our Lord. Chapter 12 of John brings this day into focus as Jesus prepares himself and his disciples for the journey. He begins the journey on a young colt, on which no one had ever sat, and proceeds along the road where some lay their praise, palm branches, and garments, while others sneer and plot. Jesus chooses a young, sure-footed animal for the journey:

On the next day, the great multitude who had come to the feast, when they heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem, took the branches of palm trees and went out to meet Him, and cry out, "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the

name of the Lord, even the king of Israel." And Jesus, finding a young donkey, sat on it; as it is written, "Fear not, daughter of Zion; Behold, your King is coming, seated on a donkey's colt."

Of all the lessons we learn in church, one of the most important is how to ride a donkey. **Jesus rode in peace, not contention and assault. Jesus rode in humility**, and this rivals the plots, scheming, and conniving of those committed to his death. **Jesus paid a very high price** — his breath was extinguished on our behalf. We are privileged to worship together during Holy Week, including Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, and Easter Celebration. We will explore more of the journey, a journey that begins in humility and sacrifice for every person. In spiritual preparation, we ask, "How do I respond to my Creator's passion for my life?" This question is personal and includes differing circumstances for us all, but guiding principles include

gratitude, acceptance of responsibility, and whole-hearted responses to the needs around us.

As we honor this Holy season in our church and lives, my hope is that we all take a reflective look at how we can apply the passion and whole-hearted effort that Jesus gave to all people in the circumstances of our lives.

#### **Executive Council News**

Executive Council met via Zoom on Tuesday, February 13. Here are highlights of the meeting:

- A/V proposal: Henry Mboowa has presented three options for a new setup. A&F will discuss and choose one at the board's meeting on February 20. The most expensive option runs about \$2,600.
- Hearing loop: A&F will not look further into this. The board will determine if audio enhancement is possible with the new A/V setup and possibly be Bluetooth enabled. In the meantime, those with hearing issues can log into the Zoom (from the sanctuary) and hear that way.
- Jay will meet with Gemini Sign on 2/15 to get a new quote to replace the two signs that were damaged and to upgrade the posts.
- The total for the Retired Ministers and Missionaries Offering (RMMO) was \$1000. Thank you!
- Those arriving late to worship service should enter quietly. Jay will remind ushers to hold them at the entrances during prayers.
- Pastoral Search Committee is complete: Cathy Azurin, Judy Llewellyn, Ethel Luton-Campbell, Henry Mboowa, Wilson Ndzi, Jay Reilly, Ceil Robinson, Robert Rowe, and Tom Stefanini. Jay has been in contact with TABCOM about a possible interim pastor.
- The Easter offering will be administered by A&F for the new A/V system.
- Judy Llewellyn will coordinate Easter flowers. Ordering information will go in the next newsletter and then in the bulletin.

The committee will update us along the way and may ask for our opinions and preferences for a new pastor.
